The Mayor and City Council of the City of Tilden met on Tuesday, September 14, 2021 at 7:00pm for the budget hearing in the Tilden Council Chambers. Notice of the meeting was given by posting at 4 locations within the city.

- (1) Mayor Botsford called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and the Clerk recorded the proceedings.
- (2) Declaration of open meetings act.
- (3) ROLL CALL: Mayor Leo Botsford. Al Smidt, Travis Rutjens, Lisa Meyer, Darrell Wyatt, Molly Navratil. Absent – Patricia Decker.
- (4) OPEN BUDGET HEARING – The budget hearing was opened at 7:00pm.
- (5) EXPLANATION OF DIFFERENCES BETWEEN PRIOR YEAR BUDGET AND NEXT FISCAL YEAR BUDGET – The presentation required by LB 148 was completed. Patricia Decker arrived at 7:16pm.
- (6) CLOSE HEARING – Motion made by Rutjens, seconded by Meyer to close the budget hearing at 7:17 pm. RCV: Yes – Navratil, Wyatt, Meyer, Rutjens, Smidt. No – None. Abstain – Decker. Approved.

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Tilden met in regular session on Tuesday, September 14, 2021 at 7:30pm at the Tilden Council Chambers. Notice of the meeting was given by publication in The Tilden Citizen/Meadow Grove News on August 25, 2021 and by posting at four locations within the city.

- (1) Mayor Leo Botsford opened the meeting at 7:30 pm and the Clerk recorded the proceedings.
- (2) Declaration of open meetings act.
- (3) ROLL CALL: Mayor Leo Botsford. Council Members: Al Smidt, Travis Rutjens, Lisa Meyer, Darrell Wyatt, Patricia Decker, Molly Navratil.
- (4) PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.
- (5) MAYOR’S OPEN DISCUSSION – Mayor Botsford mentioned that Wayne Whitwer and his wife have been staying at Sunrise Park campground through the summer. During their time here, Mr. Whitwer did some renovating to the picnic shelter and Mayor Botsford would like to thank him for improving that space.
- (6) CONSENT AGENDA – Smidt moved to approve the consent agenda, seconded by Meyer. RCV: Yes – Navratil, Decker, Wyatt, Meyer, Rutjens, Smidt. No – None. Approved.
- (7) REPORTS BY CITY DEPARTMENTS-Written reports are kept on file in the City office and are available for public viewing.
- (8) BUDGET – Motion made by Wyatt and seconded by Rutjens to approve the 2021-2022 fiscal year budget. RCV: Yes – Smidt, Navratil, Rutjens, Decker, Meyer, Wyatt. No – None. Approved.
- (9) RESOLUTION 2021-09-1 – A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TILDEN, NEBRASKA, GRANTING AUTHORITY TO EXCEED THE BUDGET LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR OCTOBER 1, 2021, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2022, BY AN ADDITIONAL ONE PERCENT. Motion made by Meyer to approve passage, seconded by Decker. RCV: Yes – Wyatt, Decker, Navratil, Smidt, Rutjens, Meyer. No – None. Approved.
- (10) RESOLUTION 2021-09-2 – A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TILDEN, NEBRASKA, GRANTING AUTHORITY TO SET THE CITY’S ANNUAL PROPERTY TAX REQUEST AT AN AMOUNT DIFFERENT THAN PREVIOUSLY SET BY THE MADISON AND

ANTELOPE COUNTY CLERKS. Motion made by Meyer, seconded by Wyatt to approve passage. RCV: Yes – Meyer, Rutjens, Smidt, Navratil, Decker, Wyatt. No – None. Approved.

(11) HEARING DATE – Motion made by Decker, seconded by Meyer to set the hearing date for the 1&6 year street plan for October 12, 2021 at 7:30pm. RCV: Yes – Wyatt, Decker, Navratil, Meyer, Rutjens, Smidt. No – None. Approved.

(12) PRIVACY FENCE – Motion made by Navratil that both property owners will remove 2 – 8’ panels of their privacy fences at the corners where 5<sup>th</sup> Street meets the alley between Madison Street and Oak Street and move those panels inward at a 45° angle, seconded by Decker. Motion also to include reimbursement of labor to move the fence in an amount not to exceed \$400. RCV: Yes – Navratil, Decker, Meyer, Rutjens, Smidt. No – Wyatt. Approved.

(13) STORM SEWER – All Council members were in agreement that the City will cover the costs of the new inlets and work to be done to replace storm sewer for better drainage.

(14) LIBRARY – No action taken.

(15) PAVING ASSESSMENT – Council directed Attorney Brogan to proceed with action on the property owner with an outstanding paving assessment balance.

(16) NUISANCE - Updates on nuisance properties.

With no further business to come before the council, Rutjens made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Wyatt. Meeting was adjourned at 8:51 pm.
